## Willow Creek Board of Directors Meeting



The great Oregon eclipse event has been anticipated for a long time. Powerland Heritage Park was designated as an official NASA viewing site.













## 2017 Annual Business Meeting

The Annual Membership Meeting was called to order at 10 am on Saturday September 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Previous 2016 minutes were read and approved. The treasure's report was given and approved.

The following items were among those discussed:

#### **Old Business:**

**Shifley Car Barn:** Initial set-up completed and tracks installed. Some additional track work is required. Weather-proof roofing and siding to be completed soon.

**ICP:** Cabinet work and lighting has been completed. Storage shelves have been added to the north side addition. Exterior painting and signage are ready to start.

G-Scale Railroad: Additional track and cars have been donated. Additional trackage is planned.

**New Roundhouse:** Vancouver Island Model Engineers donated a service station hoist for use on the turn-table installation. Phil has agreed to work on the hoist setup this winter. Another generous donation (\$2K) has been made to the roundhouse fund.

Steam-Up: Attendance and donations were slightly down from 2016.

Security: Keys and locks have been distributed. A few member key remain to be completed.

**Eclipse:** The event was a success. Donations added to our revenue.

Cans & Bottles: Bob Wolf was thanked for his efforts. The additional Oregon refund deposit boost added to our donations.

#### **New Business:**

Board of Directors: Alan Shifley was elected to a 3 year term.

**Signal System:** Last signal bridges have been installed. A warning light at the impaired vision clearance at the new roundhouse has been installed. A crossing signal has been installed outside the south gate. Work is continuing on the crossover turnouts and signals. They are expected to be completed early next year.

**Open House:** Sunday September 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Family Day: (Formerly Smithsonian Day) This year was held in May as grand opening of Heritage Park.

Gateway Project: The APMA project is still on hold.

Fall Cleanup: Much work is anticipated. Your help would be appreciated.

## Roy Anderson at Sacramento Valley Live Steamers

Roy Anderson, our friend and Lifetime Willow Creek Member, recently reached a point of transition when he decided it was time to sell his 2-6-0 Mogul, Oregon Pacific #2.

There was to be one last run at the Sacramento Valley Live Steamers Fall Meet with three generations of Roy's family on hand for the event. Roy steamed up his engine one last time and made a few rounds of the track before handing over the throttle to the new owner.

It was a day with sadness of course, but no regrets, and a wonderful recognition of two memorable decades of Roy building and running his "2-Spot."

In every aspect of life there are beginnings, transitions and endings. Our train hobby is not exempt from this. Beginnings are full of expectations and, most often, a lot of hard work to build what we envision. A piece of equipment or an entire railroad become an integral part of our life, even becoming part of who we are and what we are about. Transitions and endings are more difficult, but give us an appreciation for what we have been able to do, to have and share, and to enjoy.

## A Glimpse of History: Railway Express Agency



During World War I, the United States Railway Administration (USRA) nationalized the nation's railroads. Under the USRA, the four major and three minor express companies were consolidated as American Railway Express, Inc. (ARE). In 1920, Congress passed the Transportation Act which was largely remembered for returning the railroads to private control. However, a less conspicuous aspect of this act also made American Railway Express a private corporation. The ARE tenure as an independent company was short-lived. With the "Roarin' 20's" witnessing unprecedented economic growth for the railroads they deemed it worthy to hold a stake in the express business. In 1928 a new company was formed known as Railway Express Agency, Inc. (REA) to acquire ARE. For any railroad wanting a stake in the new operation it had to purchase stock. In all, 86 Class I railroads bought a controlling interest in the new company.
